

ELIZABETH MOORES LINEAGE

Peter Moores born 5.5.1729 in Rowley, Essex C., 'Old Mass. Colony'. Moved to N.B., Canada before Revolutionary war.

Their 8th child [1st 6 born in Mass, last 3 born in Canada] **was**

David Moores born May, 1764 in NB. He was a fishery overseer in the Miramichi. He died in Canada in 1838. He married Hannah ?

Their 3rd child **was**

Thomas Langin Moores born 13.9.1794 in Queensbury, York Co. NB. Thomas married Jane Naomi Mitchell on 22 Sept. 1818 and died in 1878.

Their 9th child **was**

Elizabeth Moores born 1828. She married John L. Mowat born Aberdeen, Scotland on 29 June 1821.

Some of the above information originates or is corroborated in excerpts of a letter to Pearl Moores from Russ Holt dated August 26, 1975 that I have in my possession .

EXERPTS FROM A LETTER TO MRS ROBERT MC DAVID (PEARL MOORES) FROM
RUSS HOLT DATED AUGUST 26, 1973.

Pearl your great great grandfather and mother were Lewis Mitchel
and Sarah Crabtree. They appear in the 1783 census of Gagetown, then
Sunbury County N.B. At that time they had 4 children, lived in a log
~~xxxx~~ house and on about 24 acres of improved land. "His character
as to loyalty is very good". Four of his 9 children were baptised in
Gagetown N.B. in 1797. His children and approximate birth years were:
Nancy 1776, William 1780, Mary 1782, Sara 1784, or 1783, Thomas 1786,
John Lewis 1789, Rebecca 1793, Phoebe 1796 and Jane Naemie 1799. (I've
added the ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ Naemie because you called your greatgrandmother
(Jane) "Naemie".)

In 1809 Lewis Mitchel received a tract about 380 acres near Ludlow
Parish N.B. (The Crown grant was to Ephraim Betts Esquire and 60 others
[Lewis among them] and totaled 14,640 acres.) Others in the grant were
Moores, Mitchel, Rideout, etc.

In 1818 Jane (Naemie) Mitchel married Thomas Moores (September 22)
They are buried in the old Athol House Cemetery but only Jane is on
the tombstone. He died last and probably wasn't put on stone. She
died September 3, 1874; he on February 12, 1878 at age 83.

In 1819 they, the Lewis Mitchels and Thomas Moores sold out in
Ludlow Parish on South West Mirimachi N.B. Where they went I don't
know but Lewis and Sara are buried in separate and unmarked graves
near Doaktown N.B. Another distant relative, Miss Louise M Sanford
(a retired school teacher) of Doaktown, N.B. EOC-IGO gave me some
of this information especially on Lewis Mitchel. The Thomas and
Jane Moores (also Mooers), family was large. II children and I. →

only have names for seven:
